


COVID-19 Guidance

Safety measures

We've put in place a range of safety measures to ensure our students continue to receive the highest standards of training, for which we're world famous.



Adapted teaching

We've adapted the way we teach by introducing a blend of face-to-face onsite and virtual teaching methods.


We're able to provide the vast majority of our teaching face-to-face onsite.



Teaching bubbles

We've introduced different social distancing measures to help mitigate the risk of transmission.

We've redesigned our timetable to ensure only one-year group will be onsite at a time, halved the size of our already small teaching groups and created 'bubble' teaching rooms.



Temperature checking

Staff, students and visitors will have temperature checks before entering buildings and will follow a new entrance and exit flow system on campus.


We've installed protective screens to reduce the risk of transmission in all our public areas, teaching rooms and office space.



PPE bags

All staff and students will be given a specially created personal protective equipment pack (PPE), including face mask and visors, antibacterial wipes, sanitiser and a digital thermometer.


Accommodation will be deep-cleaned, and our buildings, workstations and practical equipment will be frequently and thoroughly cleaned.



Safe use of resources and IT support

In order to reduce the risk of transmission, staff and students should avoid sharing resources where possible, including stationery and documents.


Students will need to provide their own stationery while on campus and print documents under our strict procedures for safe use.



Masterclasses

We have made some changes to how masterclasses will run in order to minimise contact.

Workstations will be spaced in line with government guidelines, and resources will not generally be shared and will be thoroughly cleaned between classes. Demonstrations will be screencast to a large screen so that they are easily observed from a distance.



Library

Students will not be able to study in their own time in College during Trimester 1. This means that, unfortunately, the library is closed to students.

However, a library service will still be available until 10pm Monday to Thursday, until 5pm on Fridays and from 9am to 4pm on Saturdays.



Placements

Students will continue to have placements in schools, nurseries and with families.

We've introduced safety risk assessment procedures to ensure safe working practices for all, including a system for self-isolation when necessary.
